Lulworth Castle & Park

- A magnificent former C17th hunting lodge built to entertain aristocracy and royalty. The naked walls of the Castle's interior reveal the history of this once family home and provides a spectacular blank canvas.
- Evocative basement cellars with vaulted ceilings
- Incredible views from the tower.
- Surrounding woodland and parklands peppered with wildflowers and home to England's first, free standing Roman Catholic Chapel and a C15th Church whose renovation plans were drawn up by Thomas Hardy.
- Charming C18th Castle Courtyard.

Climate & Light

Dorset is one of the warmest Counties in the UK, and the Purbeck area has its own micro climate.

In the winter months the temperatures average 90c dropping to around 20c and the average daily wind speed is 10mph but has known to be more especially along the coast.

The spring and summer month's average temperatures are from 130c but can reach 220c or more. The monthly average rain fall throughout the summer months is 2 inches and winds 8-9mph.
